

## UGACVM Student Laptop Requirement

Students in the UGA College of Veterinary Medicine's DVM program are required to have a Mac laptop computer that is able to connect to the campus wireless network and run both browser-based and installed applications.

Examples of educational activities that involve use of laptops include:

- Viewing high resolution images and digital slides
- Submitting assignments and taking electronic exams using secure testing software (ExamSoft)
- Accessing electronic course documentation, class scheduling, and evaluation systems
- Viewing recorded lectures and other multi-media content (Echo360, iBooks)

The educational content/software used by the UGA College of Vet Med is best run on macOS, so incoming veterinary students are required to have a Mac laptop that meets the following minimum requirements:

### Minimum Laptop Requirements

<b>Operating System</b>	macOS 10.11 or above
<b>Screen Size</b>	12" or larger
<b>Hard Drive</b>	128GB
<b>RAM</b>	4GB
<b>Processor</b>	Intel processor

While the above are the minimum requirements, the **recommended** models below will meet or exceed several of these requirements and can be purchased at an educational discount from the online [UGA Apple Store](#), or locally at the [UGA Bookstore](#):

## Recommendations

- A faster processor, such as an i5 or i7, as well as 8GB of RAM or more will increase speed and help with multitasking
- A 256GB hard drive or larger will allow for more flexibility and provide more storage space for documents, photos, videos and apps
- You will be viewing detailed images on your laptop, so get the largest and highest resolution screen your budget allows. 13" or larger recommended
- AppleCare extended 3-year warranty for new laptop purchases is recommended
- Our auditoriums, meetings rooms, and interactive learning laboratories use VGA and HDMI inputs. An AV adaptor that allows your Mac laptop to connect to both is advantageous

\*While tablets are useful and convenient in many ways, iPads are not compatible with several required software applications we use in the DVM program and cannot be substituted for a Mac laptop.
