Dr. Gaylen Edwards, Department Head, Physiology and Pharmacology

Gaylen L. Edwards, DVM, PhD is in his 35th year at the University of Georgia. He is currently the University of Georgia Athletic Association Professor of Veterinary Medicine and Head of the Department of Physiology and Pharmacology at the University of Georgia. He also serves as the interim Associate Dean for Undergraduate Affairs in the College of Veterinary Medicine.

Dr. Edwards received his DVM and PhD from Washington State University and conducted postdoctoral studies in the Cardiovascular Center at the University of Iowa. His research has focused on signaling from viscera and control of behavior, particularly ingestive behaviors.

Dr. Edwards has served on the multiple committees and panels for national and international organizations including the American Physiological Society, FASEB, and AAALAC where he advocates for science policy and basic science research.

Dr. Maria M. Viveiros, Director of the Integrative Biomedical Physiology Master's Program Dr. Maria M. Viveiros, PhD, is an Associate Professor and the Assistant Department Head, Physiology and Pharmacology. She also serves as Director of the Integrative Biomedical Physiology Professional Master's program.

Dr. Viveiros completed her BSc, MSc, and PhD degrees in Canada, followed by postdoctoral fellowships at both Cornell University and the Jackson Laboratory Genetics Institute. She continued her research at the University of Pennsylvania before joining the faculty at the University of Georgia. Research in her laboratory focuses on cellular and developmental biology and is supported by the national institutes of Health. Outside the lab she enjoys teaching both graduate and professional DVM students at the College of Veterinary Medicine.

Dr. Viveiros is both a Teaching Academy and CTL Lilly Teaching Fellow at the University of Georgia. She is the recipient of the Outstanding Teaching Award (2025) and David Tyler Award for Advances in Teaching at the College of Veterinary Medicine (2024) at the University of Georgia.

Dr. Lisa Nolan, Dean, College of Veterinary Medicine

Dr. Lisa K. Nolan is the Georgia Athletics Association Distinguished Professor and Dean of the University of Georgia's College of Veterinary Medicine. Prior to joining UGA, she served as professor and Dr. Stephen G. Juelsgaard Dean (2011-2017), associate dean of research and graduate studies (2009-2011), associate dean of academic and student affairs (2007-2009), and chair of the Department of Veterinary Microbiology and Preventive Medicine (2003-2008) at Iowa State University's College of Veterinary Medicine. She was also Professor and Founding Director of the Great Plains Institute of Food Safety at North Dakota State University (1999-2003).

Dr. Nolan has received several honors over the course of her career, including being named a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Academy of Microbiology, an honorary diplomate of the American Veterinary Epidemiology Society, a Distinguished Educator Award from the Blue Key National Honor Society, and the Academic Alumnus of 2016 from the UGA College of Veterinary Medicine.

Dr. Nolan is a proud triple dog earning her DVM, MS and PhD from UGA.
